

TRUE OR FALSE ANSWERS

1. The oldest ever Olympian was over 70 years old. **True!** The oldest ever Olympian is Sweden's Oscar Swahn, who was the ripe old age of 72 years and 281 days when he competed at the 1920 Olympics in shooting. The Swede won a silver medal in the double shot running deer contest, making him the oldest medalist of all time. 2. Gold medals are mostly made of silver. True! According to the International Olympic Committee, gold medals "must be gilded with at least 6 grams of pure gold." Typically, these medals are comprised of at least 92.5 percent silver, with the gold component making up only the plating on the outside (about 1.34 percent) 3. The colors of the Olympic rings originated in ancient Greece and symbolize different values, such as red for courage. False! The Olympic rings were designed in 1914, and the colors were chosen because at least one of them appeared on the flags of every nation competing at the time. 4. The youngest Olympian ever to compete was 9 years old. False, but close! Dimitrios Loundras was only 10 when he competed on Greece's gymnastics team and won a bronze medal in 1896. Today the age minimum for gymnastics is 16.

5. Marathon runners in the Olympics are required to wear shoes.

Abebe Bikila of Ethiopia won the Olympic marathon with no footwear.
